The University of Florida's College of Medicine invites applications and nominations for the position of Chair of the Department of Pathology, Immunology and Laboratory Medicine. The department has a rich tradition of excellence in clinical medicine, education and research, and is comprised of 70 faculty members who practice and teach at two hospitals, Shands at the University of Florida and the immediately adjacent Malcom Randall Veterans Administration Hospital, along with helping staff the state of Florida's District 8 Medical Examiners Office.

The Department of Pathology, Immunology and Laboratory Medicine located in Gainesville, Florida has four divisions: Anatomic Pathology, Clinical Pathology, Experimental Pathology, and a Diagnostic Reference Laboratory. The residency program is a vibrant part of the department with 23 Pathology residents and fellows playing key roles in the patient care, education, and research missions. The department also has 240 graduate students, post-doctoral fellows, and staff, for a total of about 300 people engaged in meeting all of its missions. We are within close proximity of the pristine beaches of the Atlantic coast and the fishing villages of the Gulf of Mexico. Gainesville is a vibrant community with numerous and highly accessible cultural, recreational, and athletic activities, with affordable living options ranging from lovely communities within walking distance of campus to rural options within a reasonable commuting distance.

We seek an individual with proven leadership skills, a distinguished national reputation, and record of academic achievement who can build upon the strengths of the department. The Chair will be responsible for developing a vision and implementing a strategy to strengthen and grow the existing culture of scholarly excellence in clinical service, research, and education. The successful candidate must possess an MD or MD/PhD degree, be board certified, and be licensed or eligible for licensure as a physician in the state of Florida. This is a full-time, tenure-accruing faculty appointment at the rank of Professor.
